## Her Life

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Eleanor Marie Whitfield, 84, of Portland, Oregon, passed away peacefully at home on August 20, 2026, surrounded by her family.

Eleanor was born on March 4, 1942, in Bend, Oregon, to Harold and Ruth Sandoval. She grew up on the family orchard, where she learned the patience and generosity that would define her life. After graduating from Bend High School in 1960, she attended Oregon State University, earning a degree in education. It was there she met James Whitfield, whom she married in 1964. They shared 51 years together until his passing in 2015.

For thirty-two years Eleanor taught second grade at Woodlawn Elementary, where generations of Portland children learned to read at her knee. She never forgot a student's name and kept every drawing they ever gave her. After retiring in 1998 she volunteered at the Oregon Food Bank every Tuesday, tended a rose garden that stopped traffic on Maple Street, and hosted a Sunday dinner that no one was ever allowed to miss.

She is survived by her children, Michael (Sarah) Whitfield and Anne (David) Reyes; her grandchildren, Emma, Lucas, Sophia and Ben; her sister, Margaret Sandoval; and countless friends who became family. She was preceded in death by her husband, James, and her parents.
